

Bandaging for Head Injuries or Facial UV Sensitivities

These Bandages are custom made to fit the situation. In the photo below, the face bandage was designed to protect a portion of a head that had been scalped off. The horse was already blind in the right eye and so the bandage could be constructed that covered the eye socket as well as the wound. The bandage was built to also provide optimum protection of the wound so that if the horse bumped her head, the wound would not be damaged. The wound completely healed without any complications.





Deconstructed socks used to line a fly mask for a horse with serious UV sensitivity on the face. The tubes were sewn in to allow the horse to breathe easily and to protect the forehead, nose, and mouth. [Contact us.](#)



Silver Whinnys tubes used to build a Tie-Back surgery incision bandage for fly protection during the heat of a Louisiana summer. Note a panel of black waterproof fabric sewn into the throat area that prevented the horse from tearing up or snagging the silver material, one more step in protecting the incision, if the horse rubbed its neck on the stall or paddock boards.
