Bandaging Large Joints: Silver Whinnys Large Bandage Sox

The Large Bandage Sox are made of two deconstructed Silver Whinnys[®] sewn together to make a double wide sock that has been effective in bandaging hocks, and other large equine joints; they also lend themselves very well to bandaging the torso of a large dog. The good thing about these socks aside from their versatility for use in bandage construction is that they won't be too tight, cause over compression, or restrict blood flow when used over large joints. They are a heavier bandage and tend to require additional support such as the Hock Shields[®] shown over the Large Bandage Sox. This may be the first sock we will guide you to when asked to help bandage bedsores on the hocks. They have been very effective in bandaging large area wounds up and down the legs with added support. They have been used on large draft horses where large areas on the legs required bandaging.
